SEEKING SUSTAINABILITY

Our goal is to build a self-sustainable children's eco village to house orphaned and vulnerable children. Self-sustainability can be achieved at Umoja Children's Village by producing our own products including food, clothing and furniture—and running our own safari business. This will decrease operating costs and inject money directly back into the project. Being self-sufficient will ensure we keep the financial costs of running such a village to a minimum, whilst training and empowering local women and men in skills they otherwise would not have had. first children's house plans are nearly completed, and we hope to begin building in April/ May. In conjunction with our children's home we are preparing for project sustainability.






Make Umoja your "Charity of Choice" for 2014
